

Elham Village Hall 130 Club





The Elham Village Hall Association raises valuable funds every year for the running of Elham Village Hall. Money raised is used to maintain and improve the hall for the benefit of all users.

During the past year we have distributed £780 in prizes and raised a similar amount for the hall.

By joining the 130 Club you can help ensure Elham Village Hall remains open as a resource for all the residents in our community; as well as having a chance to win cash prizes every month!

The Elham Village Hall 130 Club is a private lottery and is open to all residents from Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends. As a private lottery you have to be invited to join, you will be allocated a number and your numbers are not transferable. **You have to be 16 or over to join.** Each month there is a draw for 50% of the income. This amount is divided between 3 lucky winners on the following basis:

For example, if we have 130 numbers the income for that month will be £130.

50% will be used as the prize fund e.g., £65 split into three prizes assuming that there are 130 numbers.

The 1st prize will be £32

The 2nd prize will be £20

The third prize will be £13

You may buy more than one number per month. If at any time there are fewer than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally reduced. If there are more than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally increased.

We would ask that you pay for 12 months in advance (£12 per number). The more people who buy a subscription – the higher the prize money!

Interested? If so, please read the attached rules and complete the form with your details. You will then be allocated a membership number for every £1 subscribed.

Elham Village Hall 130 Club Rules

The object of the Club is to raise funds for Elham Village Hall.

The Club will commence on a date to be advised by the Elham Village Hall Association (once sufficient numbers have been issued).

The Club will be run by the Elham Village Hall Association. A member of the Management Committee will administer the Club and allocate numbers.

The Club is open to all residents of Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends.

Members must be 16 or over.

Members must fill in an application form (attached).

The entry fee is £1 per month per number. At least 12 months' entry fees are to be paid in advance. Payments should be paid by cheque made payable to **Elham Village Hall Association 100 Club**. You can also **transfer the money on-line** (account details on application form)

Members may have more than one number.

The draw will take place each month by the Chair of the Elham Village Management Committee.

Cheques will be delivered to the winners and names will be posted in the Elham Newsletter. If the winnings are not claimed for 6 months, they will be placed into the Elham Village Hall Association funds.

The regular monthly prize fund will be 50% of the monthly Income.

The first prize will always be equal to 25% of the total funds raised for that month; the second prize will be 15% and the third prize 10%.

50% of all money raised from the Elham Village Hall 130 Club will go towards the running costs of Elham Village Hall.

A register will be kept recording the name and address of each member, the number(s) allocated to them and the subscriptions received.

Unless otherwise advised, a member will be deemed to have left the Club if his or her renewal of subscription remains unpaid for a period of one month.



July Nature Notes

So far this year, the weather seems to have swung like a pendulum between prolonged spells of very dry and very wet conditions. At the time of writing, it has been over three weeks since the last drop of rain fell from the sky and many wildflowers are starting to show visible signs of drought stress. Yet both March and April brought such high amounts of rain that the chalk aquifer continued to rise into May and the Nailbourne advanced to the Black Robin at Kingston (despite having been very close to drying up at Barham at the start of March following one of the driest Februarys on record). Another feature of the spring that has been impossible not to notice, has been the persistent strong north-easterly wind blowing off the North Sea. This has led to perhaps the latest spring in south-east England since 2013, and a stark contrast to the very early spring of 2022. Oak leaf-

burst at Elham occurred approximately 15 days later than 2022, whilst the emergence of the first Adonis blue butterfly at

Folkestone came on

May 14th – a full 21 days later than its 2022 emergence.cont/

July Nature Notes (continued)

One upside of the wet weather in March and April were the stunning displays of cowslips and buttercups on many hillsides in May.

It has also been a spectacular year for hawthorn blossom, the creamy white flowers lying thicker on their boughs than I can remember seeing in recent years. Several orchids enjoyed excellent flowering seasons including the early spider-orchid and the fragrant orchid. Unfortunately, despite the abundance of flowering plants, insect numbers during the spring were very poor. Whilst the relentless north-easterlies have undoubtedly played a part, it is also likely that last year's extended summer drought led to the starvation of a high percentage of butterfly and moth caterpillars. Butterflies such as the orange-tip, dingy skipper and speckled wood have been noticeably thin on the ground and nocturnal moth enthusiasts have reported worryingly low numbers of moths – not good news for bats and nightjars.

Few sounds are as evocative of July and August as the chirping of grasshoppers and crickets in a wildflower meadow. The process by which these insects 'sing' is known as stridulation, and its purpose is just the same as birdsong – to claim a territory and attract a mate. Grasshoppers stridulate by rubbing their wings against their legs, whilst crickets simply rub their wings together. They can also be distinguished by the length of their antennae (grasshoppers have short antennae, crickets have long antennae). Both have remarkable powers of dispersal, and if you let your lawn grow long in July there's a good chance it will be colonised by the meadow grasshopper and the Roesel's bush-cricket. A few species have also been quick to take advantage of our warming climate; in the last

decade the sickle-bearing bush-cricket, the large conehead, and the tree cricket have all established toeholds in East Kent, presumably after flying (or being blown) over the Channel. Our largest cricket, the great green bush-cricket, is abundant on the hills above Folkestone and Dover and has a farreaching call that you can often hear whilst waiting in traffic on the A2 or A20. Our scarcest species, the wart-biter, survives on just four downland sites in southern England (including on the Kent Wildlife Trust reserve at Lydden) and due to its stocky build and rather heavy jump, is a little reminiscent of a small frog.

Wildlife to look for in July and August

Insects: marbled white, silver-washed fritillary, white admiral, great-green bush-cricket, glow-worm.

Wildflowers: Foxglove, heather, goldenrod, wild thyme, marjoram, harebell, nettle-leaved bellflower, field scabious.



County Councillor's report Elham July 2023



You may recall that KCC made a successful bid to the Government's Public Sector Decarbonisation Scheme (PSDS)for £20.6m for a variety of schemes to reduce energy costs and carbon emissions ranging from replacing lights, installing double glazing, heat pumps and solar panels on the roofs of our buildings. By far the largest project on our list was the purchase of a large solar park (21 MW) followed by the building of a smaller (3MW) solar park on one of our closed landfill sites. The grants had to be spent within 7 months which was impossible but we were determined to make good use of this opportunity and when the solar park we intended to buy in Kent was cancelled we found another one that met the grant criteria in North Somerset. The site, known as Bowerhouse 2, covers 94 acres and has 39,256 solar panels built on stilts so that the land can still serve as flood alleviation.

Bowerhouse 2 has been generating carbon free electricity for around a year now and going through a commissioning process to check for defects. It's now reached its full capacity and on 09 June, KCC Leader Roger Gough and I had a tour of the site and I cut a ribbon to mark the successful completion of the project. KCC contributed £1.4m to the purchase of the site and the balance of £14.5m came from the PSDS grant. In its first year of operation it has produced £2.8m and (when energy prices fall as they are expected to) it will still make at least £1m a year for the next 40 years. This is very welcome at a time when we have to make £55m of savings this financial year and yet more thereafter.

One of the 300+ services funded through your Council tax is Kent Scientific Services (KSS) which provides the scientific and calibration work needed to support Kent Trading Standards to check that goods sold in Kent are safe and properly measured. KSS is one of the services that's not often seen but which keeps us safe and catches crooks.

On 05 June the Kent Scientific Services laboratory in Kings Hill, West Malling was visited by Prime Minister Rishi Sunak to announce a nationwide crackdown on the marketing and sale of vapes to those under 18. It's illegal to sell vapes to children but some unscrupulous retailers have been giving free samples to children to encourage them to become future customers. With their brightly coloured packaging and sweet like flavours, vapes can be attractive to children. The free sample loophole is being closed. More generally KSS has been testing vapes on sale in Kent for dangerous ingredients such as lead and Kent Trading Standards (another KCC service) is undertaking targeted enforcement action.

KCC plans to hold a number of public consultations over the next few months and the best way to take part is to register via letstalkkent.gov.uk We will be asking for views on the 2024/25 budget which may seem very early indeed but the intention is to have savings plans more fully developed by the time of the budget meeting in February 2024. Do please take part as this is the consultation helps us decided which services to prioritise.

It has been an enormous privilege to serve my curacy in the Elham Valley Benefice. These few years have not been easy for any of us, and yet, here we are. We didn't know each other at the time but we had the same motivation to help Ukranian refugees. We never realised how difficult, heart-breaking, but rewarding it would turn out to be although we recognise it has not been easy for some of our sponsors.
When were you happiest?	Going to New York last year with my daughter and granddaughter for my big '0' birthday and more recently when Katya and Polina, our current UA Uni students from Zaporizhzhia, received grade As in their first exam, studying here online at our home. What an outstanding achievement under the circumstances, so proud of them.
What did you want to be when you were growing up?	A policewoman, but in those days you couldn't have long hair and I didn't want to cut mine so instead I spent 30+ years working in Finance in London with my chunky mobile and Filofax - yuppy times.
What keeps you awake at night?	Worrying about my previously sponsored UA guests and their families. Some have returned home now and I worry about our current UA Uni students' families and friends, some of whom are in the occupied areas, so it's a constant.
What is the most important lesson life has taught you?	When you get knocked back, pick yourself up and learn from it. Just get on with living, we only get one chance in life and there is always someone worse off than you. If you can help them it can sometimes help you too.
Which village event do you most look forward to?	My favourite is the Elham Farmers' Market but without the power cuts like this year. I always support our local businesses where I can, we need to treasure them.
Tell us three activities that keep you busy?	 Working as a lunchtime supervisor out in the field at our village school. It was only ever going to be temporary, but 13 years later I'm still there - love it. Hosting all of my UA guests and running the group. It has been, and still is, so rewarding and so many kind villagers have sponsored Ukranian people up and down the Elham Valley. We are lucky to have the Nailbourne River running through our garden so feeding all the wild ducks in Elham keeps me busy. We had 50 one evening, not so good if you like a nice lawn!
What one change in the village would improve your life?	A little outside adult gym in the playground would be great, but costly I know. Wishful thinking.
Cat, dog or goldfish?	Cats, I've had many and they all have their different characters, some really funny.
What is the worst job you have ever done?	Saturday girl in Woolworths in Brixton, London. Working on the electric light bulb counter under all the lights in summer. In those days we had to check every light bulb was working before selling them.
Tell us a joke.	A Ukrainian guy goes to the optician. The bottom line of the eye chart has the letters C Z Y N Q S T A S Z The optometrist asks, 'Can you read this?' The Ukrainian replied, Read it? I know the guy!
What would the people of Elham not know about you?	I am an indigenous cockney but I try to hide it when talking to you!
Last thoughts, final word.	Never underestimate people. Within weeks of arriving Katya (Kate) and Polina started working weekends in our village shop having never been outside Ukraine. They are a credit to their family and country. Please say 'hello' to them when you are next in there. I'd like to thank all our villagers who have made them welcome, supported them and been so kind to them. They love our village and are very happy here until they are able to return home.

LESSONS LEARNED

I have lived in Elham since 1961 and been invited to dip into my memories and share some of my experiences with the readers of the Elham Newsletter... to continue:

My first experience of working for a living was in Anglesey at the age of eight or so. I spent part of the summer holiday back in Anglesey with my father. I had a stalwart friend who was the nephew of Sandy, a glorious Cockney who might have been a refugee from bomb-shattered London. He ran a little kiosk in a lane close to my father's house, which increased in trade as the holiday makers returned after the war. Probably in the summer of 1948, Sandy had read about grey-hound racing as a summer cash-raising venture. He had heard of successful initiatives in mid-Wales and thought our village might copy. He did some research and found that a tractor, connected by a large fan belt to device with a long pole attached to stuffed rabbit would create a circular track. Sandy, ever cautious about spending any money, thought, for an initial test-run, he could get away with Donald on a revolving platform with a miracle of gearing, borrowed from the local fair still wintering after a wartime in Anglesey, and a fixed three geared bicycle with a tyre-less back wheel to drive the whole apparatus. Donald and I had roughly flag-marked the inner track, which seemed ridiculously small and Sandy had roped in three local farmers who turned up with a motley collection of dogs of various sizes and excitability. The dogs were held by their collars, as Sandy motioned Donald to mount the bike. It more or less worked. The rabbit gathered some speed and jerked past the waiting farmers. When it was about a quarter way round the track Sandy shouted for the farmers to release the dogs. They loped more or less round the circuit and caught the rabbit before the half way point and savaged it to destruction. Not to be put off, Sandy fixed another rabbit and a knackered Donald gave it one more go. This time, Sandy delayed the start until the rabbit was half way round before he shouted for the hounds to be released. The dogs had obviously sized up the situation and this time ignored the circuit and ran straight across the circle and between them, demolished the rabbit. Sandy had run out of rabbits, Donald was shattered and resentful and the farmers, who genuinely appreciated Sandy, also loved the fact that the new coming city-slickers still had much to learn from the rooted country folk. And that was the end of the experiment.

I don't know what was subsequently said in the pubs, but Sandy, to my knowledge, never, ever mentioned it again.

At university, for three years I had a summer vacation job with Finns at Nackington. I did the range from cherries to hops to harvest. I graduated from lettuce weeding to tractor driving, and because I had also passed my driving test, I could be trusted with a tractor on the road. Unfortunately, the normal trailers used around the farm were two-wheeled and attached to the little grey Fergie. The harvesting trailers were four wheeled and pulled by massive Fordsons. All went well until, overconfident, I overshot the stack-side unloading bay and had to reverse back. It was a nightmare in front of a jocular audience. And took ages.

As I left, angry and despondent, an old employee, that I had often worked with, motioned me to stop well out of the way, and said, "You haven't learned how to reverse a trailer like this, have you? Just keep the tension and with hand at the bottom of the steering wheel turn the wheel in the direction you want the back to go.

You've caused so much chaos here, you've plenty of time before we sort it all out!" I did what he said and lo! It was so!

So, once again, lesson learned.

One final vivid farming memory: I was picking cherries at Hollow Lane in Canterbury. The trees were tall, the broad-based ladder was secure and the view of Canterbury out from the tops of the trees was idyllic. Tranquillity shattered by farmer's bellow: "Pigs out! Everybody down!"

Rapid descent and issued with hurdle and together with instructions to gradually pen him in a corner and lose hurdles until there were only three left. The farmer would then step in to collar the pig. It worked: three hurdles left and me the middle one.

I must have seemed the weakest link! The pig suddenly charged at me and thrust his snout under my

hurdle. I felt the power from his shoulders as he heaved me over his back. My hurdle ran the nodular length of his spine and I was on the ground behind him and watched him scamper away followed by twelve or so hurdlers who eventually cornered him on the other side of the orchard. They had to collect him in the farm van, but without my assistance. I had already made enough of a pig's ear out of the day. I did my wounded hero act, and stayed well away.

Save Our Seventeen Elham Valley Evening Buses

You may (or may not) be aware that the No 17 evening bus service along the Elham Valley ceased from 12th February, in both directions. This will have significant impact on many sectors of our community.

It will affect young and old alike, as people will become quite isolated if they can't go out socially, also affecting those who need the buses to get to and from work, especially those on low incomes, those working as care workers or in the hospitality sector.

According to the 2021 Census, 10% of households between Etchinghill and Bridge have NO cars and a further 39% only have one car.

The decision to axe the last two buses on the 17 route was made by KCC, who we know have a financial crisis, and although they say it caused them consternation to cut the buses, we feel that it was quite simple for them to remove the subsidy that they paid Stagecoach and instantly save £46,000 p.a. We might ask the question whether KCC actually discussed the matter with Stagecoach to see if they could still run the buses without the subsidy if a campaign was run to get more people to use the bus. Ironically this all happened at the same time as central Government subsidised the fares

to give us our '£2.00 per journey'

deal.



A small group of us here in Elham decided that we needed to do something about this and set about creating a Facebook Page (for those who do social media), which now has almost 480 members, and additionally a specific mailing list for our 'Save Our Seventeen' evening buses campaign, in order to be able to easily update local people with our progress. To date this list has almost 270 members.

We discussed this matter at the Parish Council meeting in March and a working group was formed. A community bus (which could be supplied by KCC) was mentioned at the working party meeting, but this

would need volunteer drivers (who would be happy to drive a small bus in the dark along country lanes), plus back up drivers – all with associated police checks, routes and schedules being planned and maintained, and, despite putting the request for same on our Facebook page, we have not had a single reply with regard to prospective volunteers.

Through the Facebook group, we were able to get Mike Sole, the Lib Dem Member for Canterbury South involved. He was extremely helpful and has proved to be a very worthy councillor, and within a few weeks had helped us to get a meeting with Stagecoach.

We had a very positive meeting with the Commercial Director at Stagecoach.

Stagecoach is a commercial operation and it is not in their best interests to cut services as this will only reduce their income. We found out that we only need 9 MORE PEOPLE on each bus for the buses to be viable. This should not be unattainable!

We put our case to him and suggested that if he could help us and work with us, we personally would do everything we possibly could to promote the bus throughout the valley. We talked about promotions, and maybe changing the time of the last bus, to fit in with theatre productions. All in all, it was a very positive meeting.

We have to leave it in his hands, as he is trying to find some money, possibly through Government funding, to perhaps reinstate the bus for a trial period. It would then really be a case of 'USE IT OR LOSE IT'. We have no alternative at the moment than to wait and see, but if you join our mailing list and Facebook group, we can keep you posted with developments.
