All hiring at competitive rates



The trustees of Elham Village Hall sent a letter to all hirers regarding hiring charges. They always strive to provide the best facility and manage the hall for the benefit of the community. In this last year the facility has been improved in several areas, including refurbishing the ladies' toilets and the disabled toilet, installing a safe table storage

facility and there are plans to do more to enhance the hall in the coming months.

The hire charges for the coming year have been reviewed and the basic rate of hire for most hirers **will not be increased.** The next review will take place in August 2024 and be applicable in September 2024 to coincide with the hall's financial year end.

Notes:

Session times are as follows: Morning:8 am to 1 pm; Afternoon:1 pm to 6 pm; Evening:6 pm to 11.45 pm. We also offer half sessions (2.5 hours), subject to availability. The main kitchen can be booked with the Peggy Pike Room if not already booked by a main hall hirer at a cost of £10. Please request when booking. For professional catering, an additional fee of £55 is payable for the kitchen. If selling alcohol (subject to the permission of our Designated Premises Supervisor), a £5 fee is payable towards the alcohol licence for both one-off and regular hirers. PA system and microphone, if personnel are available, for your use at no extra charge. Please request when booking.

BOOKING DEPOSITS & SECURITY DEPOSITS

A deposit of 30% is required on booking. This is non-refundable except in exceptional circumstances. You will be invoiced for the balance of the hire fee 6 weeks before the hire. A security deposit of £200 is payable on all one-off bookings. This will be repaid in full provided there is no damage to the hall during the hire.

DISCOUNTS

Residents of Elham Parish: 10% discount on one-off bookings.

Regular hirers: discount depends on usage, as follows:

	Very low (<10)	Low (10+)	Medium (40+)	High (60+)
% discount (highest only applies)	10	20	40	50

Please note that these discount rates are conditional on the hirer committing to using the hall for at least the number of uses for the band of discount received. Other rates may be applied at the discretion of the Management Committee.

Please note that we will guarantee these wedding charges for bookings up to two years ahead. For bookings more than two years ahead, charges will be subject to review and may increase.

CANCELLATION POLICY FOR ALL HIRERS

We apply a sliding scale of fees in the event of cancellation. These apply to the balance of the hiring fee or your hire charge in the case of regular hirers.

Within one month of your hire - 25% of the hiring fee.

Within two weeks of your hire - 50% of the hiring fee.

Less than a week - no refund will be given.

Please note that if you do not show up for your hire but do not tell us you are still liable for payment and you will be invoiced accordingly.

District Council News

District councils can seem rather remote, inaccessible bodies, so I thought I'd highlight some of the ways we can bridge the gap.

Firstly, our newly-established North Downs Forum - last month we had our third meeting, this time in Hawkinge. We set up the forum to bring together district,



town, and parish councillors, community groups, local businesses, and interested residents, to give a stronger voice for the area. Our theme this time was supporting the local economy: we were joined by Cllr Rich Holgate, who's the cabinet member at the District Council with responsibility for heritage, tourism, and the local economy, and we heard from local shopkeepers and small business owners about the challenges of running a rural business in the 21st century.

Our next meeting will focus on biodiversity and land management. Anyone is welcome to join us for as many (or few) meetings as they choose – we want the Forum to be an informal, friendly space for making new connections and discussing shared concerns. Drop me a line if you'd like to be added to the mailing list.

Meanwhile Folkestone Community Forum is up and running, and a Cheriton Community Forum is at the planning stage. These groups are likely to be different in how they operate and what they focus on, but they all have the aim of connecting communities together, while creating an easier way for the District Council to understand and respond to local concerns.

It's not everyone's cup of tea, but it is possible to watch council meetings online, or indeed in person. Once the webcast is uploaded after a meeting, it's set up so that you can go to any agenda item that's relevant to you, rather than having to trawl through the whole thing.

If there's a particular issue that concerns you, you can submit a question in advance of a council meeting for the Leader of the Council or one of the other members of the Cabinet. You'll read out your question at the meeting, get an answer, and then have the chance to ask a supplementary question in response to what you've heard. It's one way to highlight an issue, and to get a commitment to action on the record.

The Overview & Scrutiny Committee (which I sit on) reviews and challenges the Council's policies and performance, and can take a focused look at particular aspects of the Council's business, or at issues that affect residents across the district. For example, back in February last year the committee looked at the traffic disruption caused by Operation Brock, something we might need to return to, given the introduction of much-delayed biometric checks as part of the EU "Entry/Exit System" expected in October. A call has just gone out for suggestions for topics for the committee to focus on in 2024/25, and you can submit your ideas here: https://www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/democracy/council-scrutiny

You may have seen reports in the media of local authorities declaring themselves "effectively bankrupt", and it is a very tough economic environment for councils, as it is for many individuals and businesses. We've had to make some difficult decisions (including redundancies) to address a forecast deficit of some £4.5m, but as a result we'll have a balanced budget to vote on this month – that means a budget that doesn't require dipping into the reserves to balance the books.

With that out of the way, we'll be turning to the District Council's Corporate Plan, to review and update it (the current version can be found at https://www.folkestone-hythe.gov.uk/policies-plans-documents/creating-tomorrow-together-corporate-plan-2021-2030). The plan sets out what the Council will (and by implication, won't) focus its resources on, so it's a significant document in shaping Council activity. We'll want to make sure that everyone who wants to can have their say, so watch this space.

County Councillor's report Elham March 2024



Some good news. The Government has responded to the campaign by the councils responsible for social care with £500m of extra funding. Our share of this in Kent is £12.8m which is very welcome. However, our expected expenditure still exceeds income by over £100m so we still need to make significant savings at our budget meeting on 19 February. Our most significant problems continue to be the cost of care for the elderly and the number of children with Special Educational Needs and associated school transport costs. The proposal is for the KCC share of council tax to rise by 5% from 01 April 2024.

Whilst the budget sets the overall strategy many of the proposals within it need individual consultation and you'll find these at letstalk.kent.gov.uk Two such changes are about charging for adult social care and these proposals are currently open for comment until 07 April 2024.

A reminder that there are a multitude of schemes to help people including financial help, household goods, IT equipment and training and support with mental health. A good place to find out about these is the KCC website www.kent.gov.uk where there is a link on the homepage to 'Kent Together – cost of living support'.

KCC libraries have partnered with the Institute of Accountants and Bookkeepers to provide a one hour 'managing your finances course' which covers setting a household budget, understanding your payslip, how to reduce your living costs. Understand loan repayments and access financial support.' The course is available on the free public computers in the libraries or via a QR code to a smartphone.

Last November, KCC launched a recycling scheme for IT equipment. I'm pleased to report that I've had some very positive feedback from those using it. It covers equipment such as PCs, laptops, printers and mobile phones and either refurbishes and reuses them or ensures they are recycled. A specialist process is used to ensure 100% data wiping to the strictest UK legislative standards. You can book a home collection at www.kent.gov.uk/DeviceRecyclingScheme
I attended the Parish Council meeting on 05 February and reported on KCC's efforts to get the Government to do more to help preparations for the proposed introduction of the new EU Entry Exit System (EES) from 06 October 2024. EES will replace stamping passports with an electronic system to register the dates of entry and exit by non-EU travellers and is similar to systems already in operation in the USA, Canada and Australia. On 31 January Roger Gough, KCC's leader, told Parliament's EU Scrutiny Committee that traffic modelling showed a worst-case scenario of delays of up to 14 hours at the ports and Eurotunnel once EES is in place. Roger called for funding for measures to cope with the change. He pointed out that delays in Kent also impacted on the whole UK economy and urged the Government to look at technological and legal changes to enable remote registration.

The 2024 battle against the Asian Hornet has begun.....

Thank you to everyone who kept an eye out for Asian Hornets and their nests last summer and autumn. Locally we were very successful and of the 70 nests destroyed in England 35 of them were in and around Dover.

Any Asian Hornet queens that have survived will be emerging shortly from hibernation before other insects such as wasps, bumble bees and European Hornets. By the time you read this some Hornets will have undoubtedly started flying – they emerge after three or four consecutive days with temperatures above 12 degrees C.

Once emerged they will look for some food and then disperse up to 60km to build their nests. This is why they spread so quickly and why in February your local beekeepers have been putting out traps for them in over 300 square kilometres, at 1000m intervals across the District.

Members of the public can help too. In particular the Asian Hornets will feed on something sweet and so they are likely to visit azaleas, camellias and other early flowering plants. Please keep an eye out for them and if you see one and can get a picture you can report it on the Asian Hornet Watch app or by going online to www.nonnativespecies.org/asianhornet.

There are some pictures below to remind you what they look like. They are the size of a 2 pence piece, bigger than a wasp, mostly black with 2 or 3 thin orange bands on the abdomen, one of which is broad. The face is orange and the legs are yellow. We are hopeful that our efforts last year will mean that we will not see these pests around which will cause honey bee colonies to collapse.

This is an edited version of a recent review of 2023 by KCC Leader Roger Gough which I thought would make a better report than anything I could produce.

"There are significant challenges we as an authority, like many others across the country, are facing. We are not a council that has been reckless with its finances, far from it, and our sound decisions have given us the best possible chance to stave off what has been coming down the track at us. However, we are not immune to the impacts.

Increased costs and demands on our services have meant we have had to face some very hard budgetary decisions. In Kent we have specific issues, such as travel disruption at our ports, and the response to migration and unaccompanied asylumseeking children. Despite what we shoulder, central government funding has fallen far short. There is no doubt that times are exceedingly tough.

We cannot focus only on survival but on continuing to change and innovate, while delivering good services to the people of Kent. Looking back on 2023, there have been some notable moments, some of which have seen us rising to support our residents through shock after shock, not least the cost-of-living crisis and helping people in the most difficult circumstances.

Our solid collaboration with the NHS has seen some excellent work on seasonal campaigns and the development of the Integrated Care Strategy. Our task in 2024 will be to start turning this into practical delivery across our county and our communities.

RAAC (reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete) entered the common vernacular in 2023. Our swift action following the change of national rules, helped in no small part by the rapid flexibility of our school community, kept disruption to a minimum.

We are a key partner in the Kent Resilience Forum, responding to the pressures on our extensive and much-travelled road network with Kent Police, National Highways and others. Our highways and other staff respond to emergencies on our own road network in all weathers.

We have an exceptional record in responding to the diverse issues of asylum, migration and resettlement, including responding (across many parts of our organisation) to the referral of more than 2,000 unaccompanied asylum-seeking children into our service in the last year, and working with district and borough colleagues in response to the requirement to empty the Afghan bridging hotels in the late summer.

We are committed to the environment, balancing everything we consider with nature's voice and its unrivalled positive impact on health and wellbeing, and preserving the enduring appeal of the Garden of England. I look forward to taking forward our initiatives, such as Making Space for Nature, in 2024.

These could be viewed as the 'big ticket items' and are only a small selection of the services that KCC provides. I am incredibly proud that some of the greatest effects of our work can be felt in the quiet, often unseen, interactions full of kindness, compassion and thoughtfulness from across all of our teams.



Dear Friends.

This month we celebrate Mothering Sunday on the 10th, as always, on the 4th Sunday in Lent. Years ago it was also called Midlenting Sunday or Refreshment Sunday. At that time rigorous Lenten fasting and self-denial were the norm, thus it was considered good to have a break, a bit of a feast, or celebration, in mid-Lent. That grew into a custom where people, particularly those in domestic service, or working away in towns, were given the day off to go home and visit their mothers, and maybe indulge in some hearty eating whilst there.

This event today is more often called Mother's Day, and looking at the traditional title it occurred to me that "mothering" is an interesting word. We hardly ever use it except for this occasion, and of course it derives from the verb "to mother".

The corresponding verb "to father", or fathering as the male equivalent, tends to mean something a bit different. Fathering children generally refers to the biological process of procreation. To the majority of people it doesn't convey the same nurturing, ongoing participation in child rearing as the feminine word, mothering. Even though we all know fathers may well be equally as involved in childcare. Yet to mother children conjures up images, not of someone being pregnant, or giving birth, but of a woman with her arms wrapped round her baby with protective love. That's what we usually understand mothering to be. The gender references can be confusing, and they have a lot to do with historical stereotypes. Yet anyone can fulfil a mothering role. Regardless of gender. Regardless of biological connection. And regardless of age difference. Some children are mothered by family members other than their parents, and some children provide mothering care for their disabled parents. Many of us adults have been called to care for our parents in their old age, in very similar ways to how they looked after us when we were tiny, and many provide care for their partners.

At the foot of the cross the disciple John, and Jesus' mother Mary, were commended to the care of one another. Jesus told Mary, to now regard His much loved disciple John as her son. That gave her someone to love and cherish as her own once he had gone. But He also told John to now accept Mary as his own mother, so in turn he now had a mothering role in looking after her. What a wonderful example of God's understanding of our human needs. The recognition of the gap they both needed to fill once He had left their earthly lives.

It is right that we celebrate mothers in all their wonderful, wise, generous, and let's be honest. sometimes madly infuriating manifestations. But let's not forget, too, that anyone who offers mothering to someone else, in any way, is precious to God for their sacrifice of love for others. So perhaps it's time to return to the traditional notion of Mothering Sunday, but with the modern twist of using it to celebrate anyone, regardless of gender, family relationship, age, or formal status, who bestows nurturing care on one whom they love. Amen.
