

The trustees of Elham Village Hall sent a letter to all hirers regarding hiring charges. They always strive to provide the best facility and manage the hall for the benefit of the community. In this last year the facility has been improved in several areas, including refurbishing the ladies' toilets and the disabled toilet, installing a safe table storage

facility and there are plans to do more to enhance the hall in the coming months.

The hire charges for the coming year have been reviewed and the basic rate of hire for most hirers **will not be increased.** The next review will take place in August 2024 and be applicable in September 2024 to coincide with the hall's financial year end.

Notes:

Session times are as follows: Morning:8 am to 1 pm; Afternoon:1 pm to 6 pm; Evening:6 pm to 11.45 pm. We also offer half sessions (2.5 hours), subject to availability. The main kitchen can be booked with the Peggy Pike Room if not already booked by a main hall hirer at a cost of £10. Please request when booking. For professional catering, an additional fee of £55 is payable for the kitchen. If selling alcohol (subject to the permission of our Designated Premises Supervisor), a £5 fee is payable towards the alcohol licence for both one-off and regular hirers. PA system and microphone, if personnel are available, for your use at no extra charge. Please request when booking.

BOOKING DEPOSITS & SECURITY DEPOSITS

A deposit of 30% is required on booking. This is non-refundable except in exceptional circumstances. You will be invoiced for the balance of the hire fee 6 weeks before the hire. A security deposit of £200 is payable on all one-off bookings. This will be repaid in full provided there is no damage to the hall during the hire.

DISCOUNTS

Residents of Elham Parish: 10% discount on one-off bookings.

Regular hirers: discount depends on usage, as follows:

	Very low (<10)	Low (10+)	Medium (40+)	High (60+)
% discount (highest only applies)	10	20	40	50

Please note that these discount rates are conditional on the hirer committing to using the hall for at least the number of uses for the band of discount received. Other rates may be applied at the discretion of the Management Committee.

WEDDING PACKAGE

This includes the main hall, Peggy Pike room, kitchen and bar from 15:30 on Friday to 13.00 on Sunday.

We ask for a £150 non-refundable deposit to secure the booking.

Please note that we will guarantee these wedding charges for bookings up to two years ahead. For bookings more than two years ahead, charges will be subject to review and may increase.

CANCELLATION POLICY FOR ALL HIRERS

We apply a sliding scale of fees in the event of cancellation. These apply to the balance of the hiring fee or your hire charge in the case of regular hirers.

Within one month of your hire - 25% of the hiring fee.

Within two weeks of your hire - 50% of the hiring fee.

Less than a week - no refund will be given.

Please note that if you do not show up for your hire but do not tell us you are still liable for payment and you will be invoiced accordingly.

County Councillor's report Elham April 2024



The KCC budget was agreed at a full day meeting of the County Council on 19 February. The papers for the meeting and a webcast of the debate are on the KCC website www.kent.gov.uk KCC's share of your council tax bill will rise by 5% and this funds increased spending on adult social care, children in care and home to school transport in line with demand. If anyone is in financial difficulties in paying their council tax there are several schemes in place to help – *Kent Together* is a good place to start and you'll find a link at www.kent.gov.uk or ring 03000 41 92 92.

KCC has launched a Biodiversity Net Gain Site Register for Kent. Since 12 February all developments with over ten houses are required to deliver a 10% increase in biodiversity. The aim is for this improvement to be delivered on the site itself but if this is impractical then the site register will provide a pipeline of suitable land to deliver this commitment. The Making Space for Nature Kent website has more details on this.

I attended the Parish Council meeting on 04 March where I reported on the KCC budget and we discussed KCC's efforts to get the Government and other stakeholders to make preparations for the proposed introduction of the new EU Entry Exit System (EES) from 06 October 2024. Traffic modelling shows a worst-case scenario of delays of up to 14 hours at the ports and Eurotunnel once EES is in place. It should be possible to register in advance but this needs legal changes. Eurotunnel has invested 80m euros to prepare its terminals to reduce the impact of the new requirements and the Levelling Up grant won last year by KCC for works at Dover Port should also help (though this is presently held up by a legal challenge). More also needs to be done on facilities for freight and this will not happen without Government funding. A report on this issue went to KCC's Environment and Transport Cabinet Committee on 07 March and you can read this and watch the debate on the KCC website www.kent.gov.uk

Another ongoing campaign is the one to restore the Kent stops for Eurostar services. There is a petition on this which has reached nearly 50,000 signatures. If you'd like to support it you can sign the <u>online petition</u>. KCC has also surveyed Kent businesses and found strong support for the reintroduction of the Kent stops. I know Damian Green MP, Ashford Borough Council and KCC are all involved in the campaign to persuade Eurostar to restore the services.

Do please keep reporting potholes preferably on the KCC website or to 03000 41 81 81. Nearly 60,000 potholes were repaired on Kent's roads between April and December 2023 and the work continues. The Government has allocated Kent £135m of additional funding over the next 11 years for road repairs. £8.6m of this will be spent between March and October this year. This is on top of the £50m in KCC's own road and footway maintenance budget.

District Council News

Life as a district councillor remains as varied as ever. In this report I am going to focus on the environment.

One part of my role consists of responding to events as they unfold, and that means being prepared for the unexpected. By the time you read this the weather will (hopefully) be a lot drier and warmer, but it will not have escaped your notice that we have had an awful lot of rain this winter. Indeed, by all

accounts 2023-24 has been the wettest winter for over a century and this has caused problems and tested the infrastructure across the district.

One major challenge has been draining rainwater out of Romney Marsh. Keeping drainage ditches in good condition and free from obstructions is really important. Seeing that pumping stations are well maintained and running properly is also vital. Costs have gone up dramatically in recent years, partly due to rising utility bills which makes the pumps and machinery more expensive to run. The Council has to pay considerable sums in special levies for drainage services and this can only be funded out of council tax which is a considerable burden.

The rain has also caused quite a few cliff falls recently. The area along the Leas and behind Sunny Sands in Folkestone is made up of a combination of medium to coarse grained sand and weakly cemented sandstones known as the Folkestone Formation. Shallow landslips happen quite often but have been particularly common this February and March. This may well be the result of water building up in sandstone making it heavier and less stable. The weakening of the cliff caused by trees which have been battered by high winds could be another factor. The results can be seen along Remembrance Road which leads up to the Leas from the harbour area where the bank has collapsed several times. It is also the reason why Madeira Walk along the Lower Leas had to be closed. Unfortunately, it may be quite a while before these areas can be safely reopened.

It is impossible to say that specific weather events are due to climate change but what is happening locally certainly seems to fit into a wider global pattern. This means that reducing carbon emissions and protecting and enhancing biodiversity are all the more urgent. It is heartening to report that the Council has recently received and considered a wide range of innovative applications to the Green Business Grant scheme. This scheme has been funded by the Council to help small businesses reduce their carbon footprint, enhance energy efficiency, and ultimately save on operational costs. As well as heat pumps, solar panels and LED lighting there have been proposals to cover a roof in gravel and modifications to a cooling water system which will save thousands of litres of water.

The Green Business Grant Scheme is now closed but the Rural England Prosperity Fund provides another source of finance. As a result of central government funding, the Council now has £350,000 available over the next few years to provide grants for both businesses and community projects in rural locations. Unsurprisingly, Elham qualifies as a rural area and hopefully some of the money from this fund will soon be bringing benefits to the village.

The final piece of positive news is that children from Elham Primary School recently joined pupils from Sellindge and Churchill Primary in Hawkinge for the launch of a new environmental initiative – the Schools Sustainability Project. This

is a trial project which aims to raise awareness of local environmental issues and support pupils from participating schools to take practical action to improve their surroundings. The deeper purpose is to illustrate how children of all ages have a 'voice' in shaping the world around them. I will be reporting later in the year about what the children have achieved and what we have learnt from the project.

It was agreed to reimburse the Environment Working Group £33.98 for the purchase of bulbs for the King George V.

- 2.Church wall We are waiting to receive tenders from contractors, once received these will be discussed by full Council.
- 3. The Gore— It was discussed and agreed that Harwoods would be instructed for the purpose of Building Control at the cost of £1250.00.

Dear Friends,

Archbishop Desmon Tutu wrote: 'Goodness is stronger than evil. Love is stronger than hate. Light is stronger than darkness. Life is stronger than death. Victory is ours through Him who loved us'

All of the major religions of the world have, at their heart, a recognition of the titanic battle that rages between good and evil. In some religions, this is acted out through mythical or actual battles, in others it is an internal battle that goes on in individual hearts. But in Christianity, it is God Himself who fights the battle with us and for us.

Central and unique to the Christian faith is the understanding that God Himself came to earth in the person of Jesus, who demonstrated the undefeatable power of God's love, and His eternal gift of life, through his death and resurrection.

Our faith is challenged by the violence and the hatred that we see and hear around us. Anger and greed and worldly power pervade our lives and our communities. We struggle to make sense of the scenes from around the world that we see on our screens. Evil, hatred, darkness and death seem to be on the rise.

But the message of Easter is one of hope. In Jesus, God showed us, once and for all that Goodness is stronger than Evil, Love is stronger than Hate. Life is stronger than death. Through the Spirit of God we receive strength and confidence to choose God's way of living and to turn away from all that seeks to divide us from others. We do have a choice not to slander our neighbours and friends, we do have a choice to forgive when we have been wronged, we do have a choice not to seek for worldly power, we do have a choice to seek harmony and peace, not division.

Living in the light of Easter may not give us the kind of power that could change what we see raging between the nations of the world but, through our own small acts of sacrifice, forgiveness and love, we do have power to contribute to the transformation of ourselves, our families and our communities. The Swiss Theologian Karl Baarth wrote: 'Do not allow any of us to remain apathetic or indifferent to the wondrous glory of Easter but let the light of our risen Lord reach every corner of our dull hearts'.



KNOW YOUR NEIGHBOUR

EDDIE NELSON is known as the man who goes to table tennis at the Village Hall on Mondays and the jamming sessions on a Tuesday, even though he can't play or sing. He has agreed to be the neighbour you get to know this month.



How long have you been part of the Elham Community?	Tricia and I arrived on 1 st September 2023, having spent nine months living in France because we had sold our property in Northern Ireland. We had decided to leave the province and move permanently to be near our daughter and grandchildren.
What do you consider your greatest achievement to date?	I am the only male, as far as I am aware, to have passed 64 years old in the Nelson family, which I consider to be an achievement. This is even better than Lord Nelson, he was 47 when he died.
When were you happiest?	Apart from when I married Tricia, I think when our daughter told us she was expecting her first child was one of the happiest moments of my life. The announcement of two more over the next few years was equally happy.
What did you want to be when you were growing up?	When I was doing 'A' levels the plan was to go to university to do engineering. I didn't do well enough in my grades to get the place so I ended up at Belfast teacher training college where I trained to teach geography and sport. After a couple of years teaching in Belfast I took my skills to Zambia and spent a year in a high school in Kasama near the Tanzanian border. I learned what it was like to be the victim of racism.
What keeps you awake at night?	Our renovation of the house we bought in Elham. We have no experience of employing building contractors in England and have little idea of pricing. In Ireland we had lots of contacts and experience in renovating property there.
What is the most important lesson life has taught you?	I had a stroke in 2014 albeit minor, but it makes you realise how fragile we all are.
Which village event do you most look forward to?	Since we have only been here for six months we are not fully au fait with everything that the village has to offer. On a personal level, I go to table tennis and jamming at the Village Hall and am disappointed if I have to miss a session.
Tell us three activities that keep you busy?	We have three English pointer cross dogs and I walk them nearly every day which is a daily priority We are very involved with our three grandsons, taking them swimming, helping
	with the school runs and with reading and mathematics homework. We spend a lot of time in the garden, trying to make it a pleasant environment for our enjoyment.
What one change in the village would improve your life?	We come from a rural environment and dog poo is just not part of it. I am disappointed that there is so much in the village and, if people would always pick up after their dog, this change would hugely improve everybody's life.
Cat, dog or goldfish?	Molly is our eldest dog and the mother of our two pups, Rocky and Rudi. We used to always have a cat but no longer. Never had goldfish.
What is the worst job you have ever done?	Here in the UK you have the Office of National Statistics which collects data on population. In Ireland we have the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency where I worked as an interviewer. This involved following up letters sent to addresses in Belfast and trying to persuade the occupants to give up an hour of their time to answer questions on a variety of topics. The work was always in the evening and I was constantly told no, with doors shut in my face. It was quite well paid but eventually I had just had enough.
Tell us a joke.	What did St Patrick say to the snakes when he drove them out of Ireland?
What would the people of Elham not know about you?	"Are you alright in the back there?" I think they know very little about me obviously the accent gives away where we are from, but they would not know that we spent six weeks backpacking in 2015, a year after my stroke, in Chile, Peru, Bolivia, Columbia, Ecuador and the Galapagos islands. We had planned to do it earlier, so we went the following year. Fantastic experience, wonderful people and the striking thing was we never saw anyone begging or on street corners. They would be selling peanuts, fruit but never asking for a handout. Highly recommended.
Last thoughts, final word.	We are really looking forward to our first summer in Kent.

News from Elham Valley Cricket Club

History

The club official records go back over 100 years to 1905 although it is suspected that cricket in Elham would have been played much earlier.

The club's most famous player was of course the England and Kent wicketkeeping / batsman great, Les Ames who played for the village as a youngster in his early days.

The club played for many years at The Gore – now the football pitch – before moving just up the road nearby to its present ground at Holloway Field, halfway up Park Lane hill.

The late George Palmer (much loved & missed) was the long serving president. He kindly gave Holloway to the club on a long lease, and this, together with lottery funding enabled a new pavilion and ground to be built in 1999, first matches were played in 2000.

As any visitor will attest, it is one of the most picturesque and well-kept grounds in East Kent, set in a slight bowl with lovely views of the downs.

2024 Season - Senior cricket

The new season will start on April 21st with a friendly home match against Hythe Green and run to the end of September. Groundwork started in March and will carry on each Saturday morning up to the first game.

This year the Saturday team again play in the Kent Regional feeder league, and the Sunday team play a mixture of friendly and Sunday Kent Village league cricket. All matches are played over 40 overs.

We are a small but friendly village team with excellent facilities, and always keen to attract local players from Elham and the surrounds.

Practice night is on Wednesday Evenings 6.00 – 8.00, using the nets at the ground.
