Abbreviated draft minutes of the Ordinary meeting of the Parish Council on 8th April 2024.

It was agreed that the Vice Chair (Cllr Chapman) would preside as Chair of the meeting.

Those Present: Councillors: C Chapman (Vice), G Clements (arrived at 7.40pm), B Swan, S Peall, 9 members of the public and Clerk. **Apologies:** Cllr K Lamb (Chair) and K Allen – received and accepted.

Public Contribution : Environment Group – to introduce members and give a brief outline of current and future projects.

Minutes of meeting.

- 1. **Resolved:** The minutes of the Staffing Committee of 4th March 2024 were approved and were signed as a true record by the Chair of the meeting.
- 2. Resolved: The minutes of the Ordinary meeting of the Parish Council of 4th March 2024 were approved and were signed as a true record by the Chair of meeting.
- **3. Resolved:** The minutes of the Communities and Amenities Committee meeting of 11th March 2024 were approved and were signed as a true record by the Chairman of meeting.

Chair's Report

On behalf of the Parish Council would like to wish Cllr Kevin Lamb a speedy recovery.

Thank you to all who attended the working party on 6th April putting the finishing touches to the Community Orchard.

Planning

1. The following applications were noted, consider and comments agreed:

24/0010/FH - amended plan received - Manor Lodge, Canterbury Road, Elham, Canterbury, CT4 6UG- Demolition of detached garage and erection of detached garage/outbuilding. Alternative to that approved under 22/0800/FH. Resolved: Should the Planning Officer be minded approving this application Elham Parish Council request that it be called in to committee. Concerns of the Council are: Loss of privacy to the neighbouring properties with the already installed larger velux windows. Should it be a business there are concerns with the access / sight lines onto the Canterbury Road.

23/2035/FH - Single storey pitched roof extension with dormer, replacement window, doors & roof tiles - Cockpit Cottage, Cock Lane, Elham. Resolved: No objection.

24/0265/FH - Beverlea, Clavertye, Elham, Canterbury, CT4 6YE - Proposed flat roofed rear dormer. Resolved: No objection.

24/0323/FH - Cherries, Cherry Gardens, Elham, Canterbury, CT4 6SZ - Single storey front extension, revised fenestration and render, conversion of existing garage, loft space with rear dormer. Resolved: Elham Parish Council were unable to provide an approval or objection due to the applicant making the Parish Council aware that the details on the application form are incorrect; windows are to be anthracite upvc not white upvc as stated on application for and the roof tiles were to be slate and not clay tiles as stated on the application form. The Parish Council would like to receive all amendments to allow a decision / view to be given.

24/0342/FH - Hawes Farm Cottage, Clavertye, Elham, Canterbury, CT4 6YE - Demolition of garage and erection of a two storey side and rear extension. **Resolved: No objection.**

2. There was one application received since the agenda was published.

24/0321/FH and 24/0375/FH (Listed Building Consent) - Wise Follies, The Square, Elham, Canterbury, St Mary's Road, Elham, CT4 6TJ - Demolition of non original extensions and a single storey rear extension with internal changes. **Resolved: No objection**.

3. Decisions made by Folkestone and Hythe District Council were received and noted:

23/1872/FH -17 Hog Green, Elham, Canterbury, CT4 6TU - Single storey rear and side extension – Approved with conditions.

24/0138/FH/PA- Mount Lodge, Mount Bottom, Elham, Canterbury, CT4 6UJ- Determination as to whether the prior approval of the Local Planning Authority is required under Schedule 2, Part 6 of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 for the erection of an agricultural store – **Refused**.

24/0066/FH - Longacre, Canterbury Road, Elham, Canterbury, CT4 6UE - Alterations and part replacement of the existing rear extension with bi-fold doors and skylight windows – **Approved with conditions**.

23/1313/FH - Hunters Lodge, Magpie Lane, Rhodes Minnis, Canterbury, CT4 6XP- Proposal: Erection of two bay carriage house 6m x 5.4m – Approved with conditions.

Y19/1378 – Methodist Church, High Street, Elham – This application will be discussed by FHDC Planning Committee on Tuesday 16th April.

Community and Amenities

- 1. **Church wall** Further to a lengthy discussion regarding the quotations received, it was agreed that the Clerk would request references from all contractors prior to a decision being made. It was agreed that the Clerk would submit the planning application for the works to the Church Wall at the cost of £216.50.
- 2. **The Gore** The Clerk gave an update tender packs were being sent out and once collated there would be an agenda item for a future Ordinary meeting.
- 3. **Burial Ground**
- i) Further to a lengthy discussion regarding quotations received for the tree works to the burial ground, it was **agreed** to proceed with Harmer and Sons at the price of £3894.00
- ii) It was agreed that the Clerk could expend up to £100 for the repair of the tap to the burial ground.
- iii) Application for memorial to Non Con B7was considered and agreed / approved.

Environment Group - It was **agreed** that discussions regarding a bench to the herb garden in the King George V would be deferred until a future meeting of the Parish Council. The clerk is to request a price for a bench from the Fifth Trust.

Trees - It was **agreed** that a Negative Survey would be instructed including the Gore. A full survey will be carried out on all areas in 2026.

D-Day - It was agreed to defer discussions regarding D-Day until the Ordinary meeting of the Parish Council in May.

Finance

- 1. The Accounts from February 2024 were a **true record** and were signed by the Chairman of the meeting.
- 2. The Bank Reconciliation from February 2024 was a **true record** and was signed by the Chairman of the meeting.
- 3. It was **noted** that all Councillors received the Accounts for March 2024.
- 4. It was **noted** that all Councillors received the Bank Reconciliation for March 2024.
- 5. The March invoices were agreed, and payments were approved.
- 6. The amended budget was considered and **approved**.
- 7. It was **agreed** to transfer £22364.22 from the current account to the reserve account (total of ringfenced funds).

Correspondence - The receipt of correspondence was noted, and any required actions agreed.

Date of next meeting and Close - The next meeting of the Parish Council will be The Annual meeting of the Parish Council on Monday 13th May 2024 at 7.30pm. There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.03pm




Elham Environmental Group

Whether spending time in the village's green spaces, out on the public footpaths which crisscross the parish or venturing back out to your gardens, the opportunity to spend time outside feels particularly precious this year. After another warm, wet winter, long predicted and now seemingly the norm, one can be forgiven for experiencing something like an emergence from hibernation with the advent of lighter, longer and (hopefully!) drier days.



Spring is springing in the King George V playing field. The bulb area, planted in December with the help of Year 6 students and teachers from the primary school, was showing a host of daffodils and snake's head fritillaries in April. Still emerging, and showing by the time you read this, are the alliums and bluebells. As these are all naturalising plants, we hope this area will become more and more colourful with each spring.



Our herb garden is now in its third year, and we continue to maintain it on a regular basis – you'll find it in the north-east corner of the playing field. The herbs are at their best at the moment - fresh, green and tasty – so please do go along and help yourself to fennel, rosemary, sage, thyme, marjoram and many more!

And the first wildflowers are showing in the evolving meadow area which we planted by the herb garden last year - including red campion, oxeye daisies, cranesbill and geraniums. The north end of the playing field will be full of colour through the spring and summer months and be home to a host of insect life.

Our group is still small in number, so please consider joining us if you are interested in being involved (email

Aside from our community group, there are many other ways to support nature in our corner of the south-east - the Kent Wildlife Trust is one of the 46 affiliated charities country-wide, membership of which supports and provides lots of great information about its many reserves and conservation programmes across Kent - www.kentwildlifetrust.org.uk.

LOCAL NEWS



County Councillor's report Elham May 2024



KCC has launched another round of SolarTogether, the collective buying scheme for solar panels and battery storage. The scheme is open to Kent homeowners and small businesses and several hundred households have already registered their interest. When we know how many people have registered their interest a reverse price auction (lowest bidder wins) is held with pre-vetted installers. Individual quotes are then sent to those who have registered. Individuals benefit from the 'bulk buying' price and the installers have a guaranteed pipeline of work which benefits them. There's a link for registration via the KCC website and the district councils in Kent are promoting the scheme.

Consultations are currently being held on Early Years Education in Kent (universal, targeted and specialist) and on the school term dates for the next three years. You'll find these at letstalk.kent.gov.uk and if you register to take part, you'll be alerted to future KCC consultations. There are also continuing opportunities to get involved in 'Making Space for Nature' which is creating a Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Kent and Medway. This is part of a nationwide effort to identify land that is important for biodiversity and how best to create wildlife corridors as well as reward landowners for their role in making space for nature.

KCC is currently very close to safe limits for the number of young people we have in our care. There is still only a voluntary system for transferring Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children arriving in Kent to other local authorities to share the burden. The courts have ruled that the Government needs to put in place a better system, but they have also ruled that KCC must accept responsibility for the UASC that arrive in Kent and we cannot differentiate between care offered to them and our own citizen children. A series of homes are being set up around Kent to house the UASC and recruitment is taking place for more social workers. However, as I've reported before, the numbers involved are more than any one council can reasonably accommodate.

On 06 April I helped mulch the trees planted last autumn in the new Elham Community Orchard. All the trees have survived the winter and seem well established with some already in blossom. They may need watering later in the year (hard as this is to imagine right now). On 10 April I met with fellow trustees of the Sir John Williams charity which supports Elham Primary School and makes grants to young people in Elham Parish towards their costs of studying at University, College or Apprenticeships. It's always a pleasure to be able to support our young people this way and to see the reports they send. Do look out for the notice that invites applications for grants from this autumn.

I was delighted that the Kings Arms has been declared the best pub in Kent at the 2024 National Pub & Bar Awards. Congratulations.

Dear Friends.

Easter's come and gone! This year it seemed to arrive very quickly and so soon after Christmas. No sooner has the baby been born, and the wise men from the East come to worship him, than we find him stretched on a cross and then we celebrate the fact that he has risen from the dead. As Christians we are Easter people and we carry the Risen Christ with us through the day, through every day. Jesus said that after he went he would send the Holy Spirit – and later this month comes Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. What does this mean for us, the ordinary people of God upon whom the Holy Spirit rests?

It means that as we meet week by week, we are part of the Church universal, the Church "spread out through all time and space and rooted in eternity, terrible as an army with banners, a spectacle which makes the boldest tempters uneasy." (CS Lewis)

Why are they uneasy? Not because of what we can do by ourselves, but because of God's "power that is at work in us". (Ephesians 3:20-21)

When David Livingstone first began his ministry in Africa, some of the native tribes opposed him. One particular warlike tribe said they were going to kill him and everyone in his party. One afternoon as they were setting up camp, word was out that these warriors had been tracking him all day, they were outside the camp and they were going to attack and kill everyone when it got dark.

They didn't attack that night. Later the tribe was brought to faith in Christ. David Livingstone asked the chief of the tribe, "Do you remember the night you were tracking my party?"

The chief said, "That's right, we were ready to attack the camp that night and kill you and everyone else."

David Livingstone asked, "Why didn't you attack?"

The chief said, "When we got close to the camp, we looked and saw 47 warriors surrounding your camp with swords in their hands."

David Livingstone was baffled. They didn't have any guards, any warriors.

However, later when he was on furlough in Scotland, he shared this story at a church that was supporting him. A man came up to him afterwards with his prayer journal. He said, "Look, I wrote it down, January 14, 1856. That night a group of men came to pray for you. We prayed for your protection. I wrote it down. There were 47 men praying that night for you."

That's our God; that's the power which can be at work in us, if we will only let him. Mike Chinneck

St Mary's Church relies entirely for its income on regular giving, donations and fundraising within the parish. From this income we cover our running costs, and with the help of the Friends, the essential building repairs. In addition we make a contribution to the diocese for the provision of a parish priest, and we are delighted to announce that a new priest has been appointed to the parish, Revd Carol Bates, who will be inducted in St Mary's on 10 June.

For the last two years we have had to reduce our contributions to the diocese in order to remain solvent, and in keeping ourselves afloat, it is important that St Mary's is able to claim any available gift aid tax on donations. In streamlining the process of giving, our diocese has adopted the Parish Giving Scheme, which is available to individual parishes, and greatly simplifies the process of giving and reclaiming tax from HMRC.

The Parish Giving Scheme (www.parishgiving.org.uk)

The PGS is a charity administered by the C of E to assist parishes in the collection of regular giving and single donations, and reclaiming the tax as gift aid.

Elham has joined the Scheme, and most of our givers are enrolled and very happy with it.

A giver agrees to a monthly, quarterly or annual direct debit, or a single one-off donation, and their payment is made to the PGS bank account.

A single payment of the total of all the direct debits collected in a month is then paid to the St Mary's Church bank account, and with no deductions or costs.

A list of givers is provided to the church to check against its records, which remain confidential.

For taxpayers who complete a Gift Aid Declaration when signing up, an additional 25% in gift aid tax is receivable from HMRC, and a single payment for total gift aid is received into our bank account monthly, and with no need for us to make a claim.

New well-wishers supporting Elham's church are encouraged to use the PGS direct debit or single donation facility. This will mean completing an online PGS direct debit mandate and gift aid declaration. There is no minimum amount for periodic contributions. See below for details of how to sign up. However, if you are uncomfortable with this, we will remain grateful for your giving however made, and the gift aid tax will still be recovered.

Thank you for your giving, and supporting a living church in Elham.

How to see in the night and during power cuts

Bryan Badham was the speaker at the March Friendship Lunch Club in St Mary's Church Hall. Our villager, whom so many of us rely on to resolve techy issues, came laden with various devices to help us see in the dark.

We all know how the village (one half more than the other!) suffers from regular power cuts and Bryan demonstrated how modern technology can save us falling over ourselves in the dark or during power cuts. and at little cost.

Most of these devices are available from Amazon (sadly more easily than from high street retailers).

Mains-only operated LED night lights just plug in and the PIR motion sensor gives you enough light to get out of bed to find the light switch.

Another model from Auraglow comes as mains or battery operated, with the option of a warm white or bright white light. It is a plug-in night light,

portable emergency torch and power cut safety light, all rolled into one. In a power cut it will switch on automatically.

Bryan also showed some battery-only operated motion sensor LED night lights and others that are rechargeable by USB.

The final display was demonstrated by Anne and Max Laker, beanie hats incorporating a USB-rechargeable LED torch, just the thing for walking around the village on a cold night.

The near full house also enjoyed the lunch of homemade soups, cakes, cheese and bread.

Friendship lunches are held on the third Thursday of the month in St Mary's Church Hall.

Sharing food with friends, meeting new people, that's what it's all about!

How long have you been part of the Elham Community?	I moved here from Folkestone in August 2004 with my daughter, having left my husband of 19 years. I lived above the Cosy Tea rooms. My parents lived in Elham so I already had that connection.
What do you consider your greatest achievement to date?	I qualified as a yoga teacher 5 years ago at the age of 56. I was a civil servant before that in the Ministry of Justice.
When were you happiest?	In the long hot summers of the early 1970s when we played outside; climbing walls and fishing in the river, falling in the river, swimming in the outdoor pool, roller skating, playing tennis against the shed wall. I am still in touch with the girls that I grew up with and we often talk about those times.
What did you want to be when you were growing up?	Like a lot of girls, I wanted to be an air hostess. Perhaps I fancied, what was then perceived, the glamourous life. However, from the age of 16, all I wanted to do was become a nurse. I wanted to care for others, so my focus was training in a London hospital and getting a place there. I started my training at Charing Cross Hospital in 1982.

What is the most important lesson life has taught you?	That it is very precious. I was diagnosed with cancer at the age of 31 and 22 years later it returned. I now live life to the full and cherish every moment.

Tell us three activities that keep you busy?	 -My family; supporting my parents, looking after my grandchildren. There is such joy in picking them up from school and seeing the smile on their faces. -My husband he works extremely hard and I want to make sure he
	has a nice meal when he gets home and I do as much to support him as I can.
What one change in the village would improve your life?	-My dogs. They love to walk and they love cuddles. I would like to see improved parking facilities. I have a drive, but I avoid taking my car into the village whenever I can. The situation is getting worse. Tankers down the road etc something needs to change.
Cat, dog or goldfish?	Dog definitely. Steve is allergic to cats and I used to have a goldfish called Oscar.
What is the worst job you have ever done?	Working in the operating theatres in Charing Cross Hospital as a student on a two-week placement. I was assigned to dentistry and orthopaedics. It seemed all I did was pick up wisdom teeth from the floor. I remember being asked to hold onto a patient's arm that had been cut from shoulder to elbow and thinking to myself don't let go Sharon, this person will fall apart. The diathermy machine seals blood vessels together and smells like bacon cooking. Not good to do this job when you have not had breakfast.
Tell us a joke.	What is red and is bad for your teeth? A brick.







Elham Community Shed update

We keep saying it but it's really true! Every day that passes brings us closer to the opening and use of the Elham Community Shed. The truth is that this project is far more complex than putting up a little shed at the bottom of your garden...

You read in the April Newsletter that the Community Shed is now a reality, that is the structure is in place in Elham Village Hall car park. Getting this far has already required months of planning by the project group, and numerous hours of work to get this far: planning permissions,

design, build, concreting a base, working out how the shed will work for the benefit of all.

Next step was the installation of an acoustic fence between the shed and the next-door garden (involving digging three very deep holes for the posts) which should be done by the time you read this. The shed then needs to be insulated and fitted out, electricity connected and landscaping done around it. It is very much a work in progress, but progress is being made.

This is all thanks to the project committee members, many of whom double up as manpower for building, digging, landscaping, and fund raising. And here a big thank you goes to Jan Stanyon, the queen when it comes to obtaining grants to help with funding this community project.
