

Oh my! Elham you are a wonderful bunch of people! What a way to commemorate VE80!


Anyone driving through the village would have seen that we were going to be doing something special to mark the occasion and that's just what we did.

Elham Village Hall 130 Club

An invitation to join Elham Village Hall 130 Club

The Elham Village Hall Association raises valuable funds every year for the running of Elham Village Hall. Money raised is used to maintain and improve the hall for the benefit of all users.

During the past year we have distributed £780 in prizes and raised a similar amount for the hall.

By joining the 130 Club you can help ensure Elham Village Hall remains open as a resource for all the residents in our community; as well as having a chance to win cash prizes every month!

The Elham Village Hall 130 Club is a private lottery and is open to all residents from Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends. As a private lottery you have to be invited to join, you will be allocated a number and your numbers are not transferable. **You have to be 16 or over to join.** Each month there is a draw for 50% of the income. This amount is divided between 3 lucky winners on the following basis:

For example, if we have 130 numbers the income for that month will be £130.

50% will be used as the prize fund e.g., £65 split into three prizes assuming that there are 130 numbers.

- The 1st prize will be £32
- The 2nd prize will be £20
- The third prize will be £13

You may buy more than one number per month. If at any time there is less than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally reduced. If there are more than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally increased.

We would ask that you pay for 12 months in advance (£12 per number). The more people who buy a subscription – the higher the prize money!

Interested? If so, please read the attached rules and complete the form with your details. You will then be allocated a membership number for every £1 subscribed.

Elham Village Hall 130 Club Rules

- 1. The object of the Club is to raise funds for Elham Village Hall.
- 2. The Club will commence on a date to be advised by the Elham Village Hall Association (once sufficient numbers have been issued)
- 3. The Club will be run by the Elham Village Hall Association. A member of the Management Committee will administer the Club and allocate numbers
- 4. The Club is open to all residents of Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends.
- **5.** Members must be 16 or over.
- **6.** Members must fill in an application form (attached).
- 7. The entry fee is £1 per month per number. At least 12 months' entry fees are to be paid in advance. Payments should be paid by cheque made payable to Elham Village Hall Association 100 Club. You can also transfer the money on-line (account details on application form)
- **8.** Members may have more than one number.
- 9. The draw will take place each month by the Chair of the Elham Village Management Committee.
- **10.** Prize money will be sent to the winners and names will be posted in the Elham Newsletter. If the winnings are not claimed for 6 months, they will be placed into the Elham Village Hall Association funds.
- 11. The regular monthly prize fund will be 50% of the monthly Income.
 - The first prize will always be equal to 25% of the total funds raised for that month; the second prize will be 15% and the third prize 10%.
 - 50% of all money raised, from the Elham Village Hall 130 Club, will go towards the running costs of Elham Village Hall.
- **12.** A register will be kept recording the name and address of each member, the number(s) allocated to them and the subscriptions received.
- 13. Unless otherwise advised, a member will be deemed to have left the Club if his or her renewal of subscription remains unpaid for a period of one month

One group forging ahead with their plans is Elham School which has been talking to the school in Ambleteuse. Both sides are very keen for children to benefit from this


new twinning friendship.

District Councillor's News for June 2025



Report from District Councillor David Godfrey

As I write this short report spring has most certainly arrived, and the sunshine is bringing out some beautiful blossoms. Garden centres are busy, and my local allotment (Hawkinge) is seeing plenty of planting activity.

It is business as usual at Folkestone District council which will retain its governance system of Leader and Cabinet until its expected merge into a new Unitary in 2028. Some major projects are underway such as:

- -Regeneration of Folkestone Town centre involving turning the Bouverie Square into a vibrant new public open space and moving bus stops on to Shellon Street. There will be inevitable traffic disruption until summer 2026.
- -Biannual Spring Beach Management is underway by recycling and regrading shingle between Fisherman's Beach in Hythe and Folkestone Harbour in order to protect against flood risk.
- -Romney Marsh beach chalets. More than 100 individual beach chalets, a visitor hub building and upgraded car parking (including disabled bays and EV charging points) are to be built at the Coast Drive car park, Greatstone. The visitor hub will contain accessible toilets, a Changing Places facility and a café concession kiosk.

On a lighter note, dogs of the district are being invited to put their best paw forward and attend a 'Paws for Thought' community event at Radnor Park, Folkestone, on Sunday 8 June between 10am and 3pm. Folkestone & Hythe District Council has teamed up with Folkestone RSPCA to put on a 'pawfect' day out for pets and owners with stalls, a boot sale and a dog show for attendees to take part in.

I recently attended a North Downs East Forum at Lyminge at which the subject was biodiversity. The session was well attended by both Elham and Lyminge environmental groups and some interesting discussions held around water quality of the Nailbourne which is a significant chalk stream essential for maintaining the ecosystem. I would encourage all those involved in environmental activities to encourage Parish Councils along the whole length of the Nailbourne to support each other in measuring water quality and understand how to properly manage this valuable asset.

On a political note readers will be aware that on 1st of May 2025 the Reform Party overwhelmingly took control of Kent County Council. Very few of the Reform Councillors have previous local government experience and only time will tell how they adapt to managing a budget in excess of 2.5 billion providing essential public services inc. Adult Social Care, Children's services. Transport, Waste Services. Highways and more. The new Reform County Councillor for Elham Valley is Christopher Hespe - Christopher.Hespe@kent.gov.uk

Our previous County Councillor Susan Carey decided to step down from local politics some months back in order to enjoy retirement with her husband. I would like to personally thank her for her years of dedicated service and support for me in my role as a District Councillor.

I'll close by wishing everyone a pleasant Summer.

More District Councillor's News for June 2025

Community grants

This year the District Council established a Green Grant programme to support the work of community groups, small businesses, and parish councils with projects focused on sustainability. Nearly 60 applications have been received and are currently being



evaluated. Meanwhile, F&HDC have just been awarded some more funding from the government's Rural England Prosperity Fund – the last round saw a number of projects in the North Downs area get funding, and we hope there will be plenty of applications this time too: get in touch if you'd like to know more.

Working with young people

One of the Council's objectives is to work more closely with young people and to involve them in decision making. This spring we held a Youth Forum in the Council Chamber to consult with representatives from all the secondary schools in the district about their ideas for the future. There will be another meeting of the Forum this coming September. We have also been working in different ways with primary schools in Hythe, Cheriton and Hawkinge on environment and sustainability issues.

North Downs Forum

We set up the North Downs Forum to bring together town and parish councils, community groups, and interested individuals across the North Downs area. The idea is to share ideas and expertise, and to get a stronger voice for our rural communities at the District Council. At our May meeting we focused on biodiversity and land use: we heard about the work of the Lyminge and Elham environment groups, with some ideas for how they might collaborate – for example on an Elham Valley wildlife walk – and we discussed a project to celebrate and protect the Nailbourne. Future meetings will focus on history and heritage, waste and recycling, and transport and highways. Meetings are informal, and anyone is welcome to come along: if you're interested, get in touch and we'll add you to the mailing list.

Council house building

Back in 2023 the Council's target was to build 20 new council homes a year, so 80 across the four-year term. The latest plan is for 99 council homes to be built over the next two years, with another 77 affordable homes being delivered by Orbit on the F&HDC site at Biggins Wood.

Food waste

The Council has been working with KCC on a campaign to reduce food waste. The simple measure of putting stickers on everyone's bins proved surprisingly effective: 14% more food waste was recycled across the district over a 15-week period. With Dover's contribution, that meant 200 tonnes of food waste was diverted from landfill. This is all part of the "Raise the Rate" campaign, aimed at raising the district's recycling rate to 50%, and the next area to be focused on will be recycling paper and card.

Council changes

May marked the beginning of a new council year and, with the KCC elections, a change to the County Council. Susan Carey stood down after twenty years of representing people in the Elham Valley, and I've heard plenty of tributes to the work that she's done in our communities over that time. On a personal note, I've taken over the Cabinet brief for the Place Plan, Heritage, Tourism, and the District Economy – that covers a multitude of opportunities and challenges, and do get in touch if you have questions or ideas to share.

Summer wildlife at Jumping Downs

Saturday 7th June, 10.30am to 12pm (1st walk) and 1pm to 2.30pm (2nd walk). Meet at the entrance to Jumping Downs on South Barham Hill (the gate will be open to allow parking in the field).

Dear Friends,

In 1971, when it was decided that the Spring Bank Holiday should be fixed for the last Monday in May, the holiday lost its centuries-old link to Whitsun; as a result, even the name has been forgotten, and with it any sense of celebration beyond natural joy at the prospect of a day off at a particularly beautiful time of year. But the Church, of course, does not forget. Whitsun – Pentecost – is the 50th day after Easter and marks the time when Jesus' disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit. This year as Easter was late, it falls on June 8th; the churches of the Elham Valley will meet in Elham church at 5.00pm for a special celebration of Prayer and Praise to which all are invited.

It is more than appropriate that this will be a service by and for all the churches across the Valley, for if anything is certain about this most mysterious Person of the Trinity it is that no single denomination has a monopoly on the Holy Spirit's presence and its gifts. Not even the whole Christian Church may claim this, for the Bible is very clear that the Spirit cannot be contained or defined, but will pop up whenever and wherever it wishes, amongst people of all faiths and none, its impact seen in lives that shine with courage and love, often in terrible circumstances.

In times that seem increasingly fragile and precarious it is this irrepressible freedom and wildness of the Spirit that keeps me hopeful. Even were the whole Church to disappear, the Spirit, along with God the Father and Jesus the Son, will never end or cease its work of love and peace. Unseen as the wind, the Spirit will always remain free to blow where it will, sometimes comforting and gentle as a cool breeze in summer, sometimes ripping like a tornado through injustice and oppression; sometimes brooding over the face of the waters, just as it did before the beginning of time. 





History

The official club records go back over 100 years to 1905 although it is suspected that cricket in Elham would have been played much earlier.

The club's most famous player was of course the England and Kent wicketkeeping / batsman great Les Ames who played for the village as a youngster in the early days.

The club played for many years at The Gore – now the football pitch – before moving close nearby to its present ground at Holloway Field, halfway up Park Lane hill.

The late George Palmer (much loved & missed) was the long serving president. He kindly gave Holloway to the club on a long lease, and this, together with lottery funding, enabled a new pavilion and ground to be built in 1999, first matches were played in 2000.

As any visitor will attest, it is one of the most picturesque and well-kept grounds in East Kent, set in a slight bowl with lovely views of the downs.

2025 Season - Senior cricket

The new season is planned for w/e 26th April and fixtures run to the end of September. Groundwork started in mid-March and will carry on each Saturday morning up to the first game.

This year the Saturday team will again play in the Kent Regional feeder league, and the Sunday team play a mixture of friendly and Sunday Kent Village league cricket. All matches are played over 40 overs.
