Elham Village Hall 130 Club

An invitation to join Elham Village Hall 130 Club

The Elham Village Hall Association raises valuable funds every year for the running of Elham Village Hall. Money raised is used to maintain and improve the hall for the benefit of all users.

During the past year we have distributed £780 in prizes and raised a similar amount for the hall.

By joining the 130 Club you can help ensure Elham Village Hall remains open as a resource for all the residents in our community; as well as having a chance to win cash prizes every month!

The Elham Village Hall 130 Club is a private lottery and is open to all residents from Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends. As a private lottery you have to be invited to join, you will be allocated a number and your numbers are not transferable. **You have to be 16 or over to join.** Each month there is a draw for 50% of the income. This amount is divided between 3 lucky winners on the following basis:

For example, if we have 130 numbers the income for that month will be £130.

50% will be used as the prize fund e.g., £65 split into three prizes assuming that there are 130 numbers.

- The 1st prize will be £32
- The 2nd prize will be £20
- The third prize will be £13

You may buy more than one number per month. If at any time there is less than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally reduced. If there are more than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally increased.

We would ask that you pay for 12 months in advance (£12 per number). The more people who buy a subscription – the higher the prize money!

Interested? If so, please read the attached rules and complete the form with your details. You will then be allocated a membership number for every £1 subscribed.

Elham Village Hall 130 Club Rules

- 1. The object of the Club is to raise funds for Elham Village Hall.
- 2. The Club will commence on a date to be advised by the Elham Village Hall Association (once sufficient numbers have been issued)
- 3. The Club will be run by the Elham Village Hall Association. A member of the Management Committee will administer the Club and allocate numbers
- **4.** The Club is open to all residents of Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends.
- **5.** Members must be 16 or over.
- **6.** Members must fill in an application form (attached).
- 7. The entry fee is £1 per month per number. At least 12 months' entry fees are to be paid in advance. Payments should be paid by cheque made payable to Elham Village Hall Association 100 Club. You can also transfer the money on-line (account details on application form)
- **8.** Members may have more than one number.
- **9.** The draw will take place each month by the Chair of the Elham Village Management Committee.
- **10.** Prize money will be sent to the winners and names will be posted in the Elham Newsletter. If the winnings are not claimed for 6 months, they will be placed into the Elham Village Hall Association funds.
- **11.** The regular monthly prize fund will be 50% of the monthly Income.
 - The first prize will always be equal to 25% of the total funds raised for that month; the second prize will be 15% and the third prize 10%.
 - 50% of all money raised, from the Elham Village Hall 130 Club, will go towards the running costs of Elham Village Hall.
- **12.** A register will be kept recording the name and address of each member, the number(s) allocated to them and the subscriptions received.
- 13. Unless otherwise advised, a member will be deemed to have left the Club if his or her renewal of subscription remains unpaid for a period of one month

After an extensive discussion, involving members of the public, it was agreed that District Councillor Scoffham would convey the parishioners' views to FHDC Licensing and Planning Department. It was requested that Cllr Scoffham confirms the current situation with regards to the revoked license as it have become evidently clear that current residents are under the impression the license is in place.

The Well - Following correspondence from a parishioner regarding the installation of an information board at the Well, the Council agreed to grant permission for the board to be installed on the fencing surrounding the Well. The Council also approved the expenditure of £40 plus VAT for the purchase of an A3-sized information board.

War Memorial - Following the correspondence received from the Royal British Legion requesting a new inscription to the war memorial. The Council approved the expenditure of £150 plus VAT for the inscription of Able Seaman Raymond D Castle.

Churchwall - The Council approved the Acceptance of Construction Quotation letter and agreed that the Clerk would sign the letter on behalf of the Council.

It was agreed that the Clerk would continue to get tenders for the rolling maintenance of the Church wall. It was agreed that the Clerk would email the draft planning application for the tumbling buttresses to all Cllrs to approve prior to submission.

Twinning - There was nothing new to report from the Elham and Ambleteuse Twinning Association Chair. Ambleteuse will be opening their new sporting facility on 26th October, and the Elham Valley football team has been invited to play the inaugural match. While this presents excellent publicity for both Elham and the football clubs involved, it was agreed that the event cannot be funded from the Twinning allocated budget.

Wellbeing- The Wellbeing Group will be holding a fundraising event on 13th February in support of South East Mind in Elham Village Hall. The Council approved the expenditure of £68.00 for the deposit of the venue hire.

Environment Working Group - Further to correspondence received regarding the Environment Group potentially selling bat and bird boxes at the Christmas Farmers Market, it was discussed that the Group would look into costing. A further discussion will take place regarding the allocation of any funds raised.

Consultation – KCC Budget 2026/2027 it was agreed that Councillors would respond as individuals. This is an open consultation meaning members of the public are welcome to respond. www.kent.gov.uk/about-the-council/finance-and-budget/our-budget

Correspondence - The receipt of correspondence was noted, and any required actions agreed. See appendix 2.

It was agreed to exclude the public and press under section 12 of Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960.

The Gore—The Council approved the placement of a porta cabin next to the existing cabin, to be converted into temporary changing room facilities. This arrangement will remain in place until sufficient funds are raised for the extension and refurbishment of the existing pavilion. Both containers will be clad in timber to ensure they are in keeping with the appearance of the current pavilion. For the purpose of transparency, it was noted that the cost of the porta cabin has been covered through donations made to the Parish Council for this purpose.

<u>Date of next meeting and Close -</u> The next meeting will be the Ordinary meeting of the Parish Council on Monday 6th October 2025 at 7.30pm. There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.13pm.

Report from Christopher Hespe Kent County Councillor for Elham Valley





Local Government Reorganisation

Kent's Leaders from the district councils and KCC met on 3 September 2025 to determine which of seven options for the future structure of local government in Kent should go forward for de-

tailed appraisal by consultants KPMG. The districts selected an option involving three unitary authorities and one with four unitaries to be appraised. KCCs option was not favoured by the districts. KCC will now commit to undertaking a detailed business case for its favoured model, which it believes will compare well against the other two options. The KCC option involves the creation of one Unitary Council ('Kent Council') that includes three Area Assemblies. In addition, there would be Parish, Town or Community Councils at local level. With this option, there would be no need for a Strategic Mayoral Authority. Hence, this proposal would be less expensive, easier to establish and have a mix of local and strategic capability compared to the other options. It would also have only two tiers, rather than the three tiers being put forward by districts.

Submissions from Kent are due to be made to government by 28 November. KCC is keen to consult widely on the proposals. Every one of Kent's district council Leaders stated or voted that they did not wish the joint consultation to ask whether the public and stakeholders believe there is a need for major restructure of local government in Kent; whether cost should be a major consideration in any restructure, and whether Kent residents would be prepared to pay more in Council Tax due to reorganisation. These questions will be asked by KCC as a core part of its consultation.

Road Repairs

KCC has earmarked £67 million for new road repairs, including carrying out a record number of pothole repairs. Recent road repairs and resurfacing works in Elham Valley have included Spitfire Way, Hawkinge, the High Street in Etchinghill, and a section of Stone Street (B2086) near Petham.

KCC Budget Consultation

Please do take part in the consultation regarding the KCC budget for 2026/27. Currently, it looks as though KCC will have to find a further £50 million in savings and income in that year to balance the books. The public is being asked where savings should be made and which services should be protected. The consultation ends on 29 September 2025.

Home to School Transport for Special Needs Children

New software is being implemented to simplify journey planning and make savings where possible.

Women and Girls Safety Partnership

KCC is establishing a new working relationship with the organisation with a number of initiatives being planned to make our streets safer for women and girls in Kent.

Savings

KCC has announced more than £40 million of new savings from its future spend, in addition to £45 million of revenue savings achieved to date in 2025/26 and debt reduction of £16 million, following the difficult financial position that the new Reform administration inherited from the outgoing administration at County Hall.

Property and Land Disposals

KCC has a legal duty to dispose of any land and property that is surplus to its needs. KCC is stepping up its disposals work in order to strengthen its reserves.

Small Member Community Grants

Small grants in the region of £250 to £500 are available for community events and activities. Voluntary sector and not-for-profit organisations who wish to explore whether they could receive a grant should contact Christopher Hespe on Christopher.Hespe@kent.gov.uk

District Council Update - Cllr James Butcher

Green Grants

More than 30 organisations including community groups, parish councils and schools are benefiting from funding to support sustainability and carbon reduction projects across the district, as part of F&HDC's Green Grant scheme. The funding will support projects including electrical recycling, tree planting, developing sensory



gardens, restoring ponds, growing mushrooms on spent coffee grounds, and installing solar panels. The 38 projects were chosen by a panel of councillors from a list of almost 60 applications, and the grants range from a few hundred pounds to £20,000.

Rural England Prosperity Fund

Hot on the heels of the Green Grant scheme, we have funding available through the Rural England Prosperity Fund. This is designed to support local growth and productivity, improve rural services and enhance community well-being across eligible areas.

If you are a rural business seeking to diversify your income, develop new products or upgrade your facilities, this fund may be able to help. Similarly, it could be the right fund for your community organisation if you want to improve local infrastructure or facilities that benefit local people and the local economy.

The fund has been designed to be very broad ranging with the expectation that applicants will come forward with pioneering and exciting projects. If your project aligns with these goals, this could be a fantastic opportunity to secure funding for your initiatives!

North Downs Forum

For July's North Downs Forum we focused on identifying tourism attractions in the local area. F&HDC has been producing pads of tear-off tourism maps for hotels and other outlets, and the map for North Downs will complete the series. If you weren't at the meeting but have details of something that should be included on the map, do let me know.

The next meeting will be on 2nd October at 19.00, venue TBC, and will focus on waste, recycling, and litter. Anyone is welcome to come along and join the discussion, and you can email me if you would like to be added to the mailing list.

The EU Entry Exit System

The much-delayed EU Entry Exit System starts on 15th October. The EU are planning a phased introduction of the system, but we understand that Eurotunnel and Port of Dover are keen to ramp up the system as quickly as possible, in order to be fully prepared for the busy Easter break.

Eurotunnel have created a registration area after the existing check-in kiosks, while the Port of Dover registration area will be at Western Docks, and UK cars will need to go there first before proceeding on to Eastern Docks.

Love Your Beach


As part of the measures put in place to keep the district's beaches as clean as possible over the summer, four new solar-powered compactor bins have been installed at key locations. Another innovation is the use of electric bikes to collect waste. These can reach locations that are inaccessible to vehicles and run regular patrols throughout the day. Coping with the huge influx of visitors over the summer has been a major challenge - at peak times the collection teams are out from 6.30 am with a last round finishing by 9pm.

Protecting the coast

F&HDC have been awarded £2.23m from the Environment Agency for coastal protection measures. This will cover the costs of moving and regrading the shingle along 7km of coastline from Folkestone to Hythe for the next five years. The work is undertaken twice a year and is the most effective way of helping to protect 3,000 coastal homes from flooding.
