



Elham Village Hall 130 Club

An invitation to join Elham Village Hall 130 Club

The Elham Village Hall Association raises valuable funds every year for the running of Elham Village Hall. Money raised is used to maintain and improve the hall for the benefit of all users.

During the past year we have distributed £780 in prizes and raised a similar amount for the hall.

By joining the 130 Club you can help ensure Elham Village Hall remains open as a resource for all the residents in our community; as well as having a chance to win cash prizes every month!

The Elham Village Hall 130 Club is a private lottery and is open to all residents from Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends. As a private lottery you have to be invited to join, you will be allocated a number and your numbers are not transferable. **You have to be 16 or over to join.** Each month there is a draw for 50% of the income. This amount is divided between 3 lucky winners on the following basis:

For example, if we have 130 numbers the income for that month will be £130.

50% will be used as the prize fund e.g., £65 split into three prizes assuming that there are 130 numbers.

- The 1st prize will be £32
- The 2nd prize will be £20
- The third prize will be £13

You may buy more than one number per month. If at any time there is less than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally reduced. If there are more than 130 numbers sold then the prize fund will be proportionally increased.

We would ask that you pay for 12 months in advance (£12 per number). The more people who buy a subscription – the higher the prize money!

Interested? If so, please read the attached rules and complete the form with your details. You will then be allocated a membership number for every £1 subscribed.

Elham Village Hall 130 Club Rules

- 1. The object of the Club is to raise funds for Elham Village Hall.
- 2. The Club will commence on a date to be advised by the Elham Village Hall Association (once sufficient numbers have been issued)
- 3. The Club will be run by the Elham Village Hall Association. A member of the Management Committee will administer the Club and allocate numbers
- **4.** The Club is open to all residents of Elham and the surrounding area, their family and friends.
- **5.** Members must be 16 or over.
- **6.** Members must fill in an application form (attached).
- 7. The entry fee is £1 per month per number. At least 12 months' entry fees are to be paid in advance. Payments should be paid by cheque made payable to Elham Village Hall Association 100 Club. You can also transfer the money on-line (account details on application form)
- **8.** Members may have more than one number.
- **9.** The draw will take place each month by the Chair of the Elham Village Management Committee.
- **10.** Prize money will be sent to the winners and names will be posted in the Elham Newsletter. If the winnings are not claimed for 6 months, they will be placed into the Elham Village Hall Association funds.
- 11. The regular monthly prize fund will be 50% of the monthly Income.
 - The first prize will always be equal to 25% of the total funds raised for that month; the second prize will be 15% and the third prize 10%.
 - 50% of all money raised, from the Elham Village Hall 130 Club, will go towards the running costs of Elham Village Hall.
- **12.** A register will be kept recording the name and address of each member, the number(s) allocated to them and the subscriptions received.
- 13. Unless otherwise advised, a member will be deemed to have left the Club if his or her renewal of subscription remains unpaid for a period of one month



Financial Regulations - The amendments discussed at the working group party were considered and it was agreed adopt this version of the Financial Regulations.


Procurement Guidance - The draft procurement guidance was considered, and it was agreed to adopt this version of the Procurement Guidance, to be reviewed in line with amendments to the Procurement Act if and when necessary.

Churchwall - Following the August Ordinary Meeting—where it was discussed and agreed that the Clerk would request updated tenders from contractors due to delays in the process and increased material costs—one updated tender has been received to date. In order for the Council to make a fair comparison, it is essential that the remaining tenders are submitted. Once all tenders have been received, if necessary, an Extraordinary Meeting will be convened to finalise the decision.

Trees – The Arboriculturist Condition Survey has taken place, and the report will be sent in due course,

Twinning-An update was given by the Elham and Ambleteuse Twinning Association Chair. Ambleteuse have now received approval for their Association.





There is a request for the Council to contribute to the cost of the domain for the Twinning Association website, it was agreed that this can be considered at a later date.

Environment Working Group - The EWG request to install a bat box to the trees adjacent to the War Memorial was agreed.

It was discussed that the EWG would advise the council of how they propose installing the water bowser to the KGV.

Correspondence - The receipt of correspondence was noted, and any required actions agreed.

To exclude the public and press under section 12 of Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960 due to the sensitivity of the items - it was agreed to defer until a future Ordinary meeting.

The Gore – it was agreed to defer until a future Ordinary meeting.

Date of next meeting and Close -The next meeting will be the Ordinary meeting of the Parish Council on Monday 1st September 2025 at 7.30pm. There being no further business the meeting closed at 9.00pm

District Council Report

Design Code

The Design Code is a planning document setting out specific requirements for new development. The Council wants the code to reflect local knowledge and preferences eg building materials, energy efficiency and car parking. Parish Councils and community groups are invited to take part in a community panel by completing a brief online application form or by emailing planning.policy@folkestone-



hythe,gov.uk for more information. In person workshops will be held on Sunday 28 September (am) and Saturday 29 November (pm). If you are interested, please do take part.

A260 Densole

We continue to campaign to reduce the speed limit from 40 to 30 mph on the A260 in Densole. This busy stretch of road carries up to 90,000 vehicle movements a week and it passes through the heart of a built-up area where there are eight bus stops. Reducing the traffic speed would add just 20 seconds to a journey but has been fiercely resisted by the relevant authorities. With the recent changes in administration at KCC we are hopeful that we may at last be able to make some progress.

Love Your Beach

As part of the special arrangements to keep the district's beaches as clean as possible this summer, four new solar powered compactor bins were installed at key locations. A further innovation has been the use of electric bikes to collect waste. These can reach locations that are inaccessible to vehicles and run regular patrols throughout the day.

Protecting the coast

The Council has recently heard that it has been successful in a £2.23 million bid to the Environment Agency for coastal protection measures. This will cover the costs of moving and regrading the shingle along 7km of coastline from Folkestone to Hythe for the next five years. The work is undertaken twice a year and is the most effective way of helping to protect around 3,000 coastal homes from flooding.

Goldpark Caravan Park, Wingmore

There have been a number of long-term planning issues regarding this site since it was first started to be used for caravans some 20 years ago. The site is now in receivership and the occupants have been told to leave. There are currently 22 people living at the caravan park in 18 dwellings, the caravans have not been moved for many years and the occupants do not have vehicles to tow them away. The Council is monitoring developments and offering what help it can as the situation unfolds

Heritage Ponds

In the past there were literally hundreds of ponds scattered across the North Downs. These were not only used by farm animals, they were important for wildlife. Officers from the National Landscape team are now launching a project to restore some of these heritage ponds as most of them have fallen into disrepair. The Council is supporting this work through its Green Grants scheme and three ponds in the Acrise area have been identified for a pilot study which will involve studying the silt for historical evidence as well as ecological surveys.

Kent County Councillor Update Report for Parishes, August 2025



KCC Budget Consultation

The County Council commenced its consultation on the budget for 2026/27. There will be significant challenges ahead, particularly in Adult Social Care and Special Education Needs, so the Council will be looking to run services differently and to make savings without impacting front-line services adversely. The consultation asks residents of Kent for their priorities. The consultation document and questionnaire is available on-line and at libraries until mid-September 2025.

Electric Vehicle Charging Points

KCC has been allocated £12.28 million in capital funding and £1.015 revenue funding by the government to develop a county-wide approach to electric vehicle (EV) charging. The scheme being developed in Kent should generate £50 to £70 million capital investment into Kent. The aim is to develop local, low-power, on-street charging infrastructure for EVs. The project will install 5,000 to 10,000 charger sockets over a 10-year delivery period. KCC will earn an income from the contract with the selected provider over 20 years, with estimates ranging up to £17 million over that period.

KCC's Performance

An analysis of KCC's overall performance has shown that performance of the Contact Centre, in financial management and in infrastructure management are good. However, improvements are required in the speed of responses to complaints and Freedom of Information requests.

KCC Leader's Speech

The Leader of KCC, Linden Kemkaran, presented a speech to Full Council on 10 July 2025, at which she announced progress so far since the new Reform UK Administration took control of the County Council on 6 May 2025. Her speech included some of the financial savings that have been identified so far and the direction of travel for the Council. The speech can be viewed on the KCC website in the Committee section.

Highways Improvement Plans (HIPs)

Although 88% of Kent's Parishes have Highways Improvement Plans, there are still seven in Elham Valley which do not have a plan. A HIP is usually produced by a Town or Parish Council and identifies the priorities for Highways investment. An area without a HIP is less likely to be allocated funding for its projects. Please check your Parish/Town Council has a HIP.

Community Grants

All KCC Councillors have a few thousand pounds to allocate as small grants to bona fide, constituted, voluntary or non-profit groups for events and activities. They could be sport or arts groups, church groups, or veterans' associations, for instance. The applicant organisation must have a bank account. The grants usually range from £250 to £500 in size. UK Power Networks has commissioned 'We Are Group' to deliver a range of free advice services to help individuals and families struggling with fuel poverty. The advice covers debt, scam protection and energy use guidelines. Everyone who signs up to the scheme will receive a 1-to-1 appointment in order to tailor the advice specifically to their situation. BEE WISE - Valley Bees News

It has been a busy summer with periods of dry hot weather and periods of heavy rain but fortunately the bees have responded well and amongst the 7 hives that we have scattered around Elham, most have faired well.

In June we were able to rescue a large swarm of bees from Farthing Common which was relocated to a quarantined apiary near Ottinge but unfortunately they were suffering from Chronic bee paralysis virus (CBPV) which is a disease affecting adult honeybees, causing paralysis and ultimately death. The virus primarily targets the nervous system of adult bees, leading to visible symptoms like trembling, shaking,



and wing paralysis. Infected bees also appear shiny, hairless, and darker than normal, as healthy bees remove their hairs in an attempt to remove them from the hive.

On the other side of the coin another empty hive was visited by some scout bees and within 3 days a swarm arrived and decided to accept the hostelry offered. The swarm has settled in well, been relocated locally and is now busy getting ready for autumn and winter.

Asian Hornet Update

There have been more nests in our area compared to last year, but these have been mainly around the coast again and would suggest they are the result of 'blown over queens', rather than from established nests

The genetics so far show only one queen, which turned up at Chartham earlier this year, was the result of a nest taken late in '24 in Coldred. A recent statement from NBU (National Bee Unit) says there is no data to suggest that the hornets are endemic

A major advance is the NBU have trialled successfully tracking devices which significantly reduce the time taken to find a nest. You may have seen this on the news. This is a 'game changer' for them. What we now need is a cheap, but equally effective device to monitor for hornets. Do not despair various people are engaged in such projects and within a short space of time they will be available.

Finally.....

We are holding the line; the NBU say there is no data to say they are endemic; as other BKA's methodically clear out the nests in their area and new technology comes on line, the number of nests will fall.

A hornet nest was discovered on the 14th August at Exted after a number of days monitoring hornet traps. The nest was destroyed by the NBU the following day.

In conjunction with the Elham Community Shed I will be doing a bees wax candle making workshop in the Autumn – watch the Newsletter for details.

On the evening of Saturday 2nd August thieves broke into the Elham Valley Line Trust, Railway Museum at Peene.




Their objective was the original enamel advertising signs that adorned the outside of many of the railway buildings.

Sir John Williams Trust, Elham - Further Education Grants

This is the time of the year when some young people of the Parish are looking to further their studies away from home and embark on a course of further education at college or university. Funds can be stretched almost beyond bounds with the cost of books and equipment to ensure a smoother learning experience and a grant, however small, can help.

The Sir John Williams Trust may be able to help and you can apply in the following manner:

You must supply a curriculum vitae and full details of the course of studies to be followed, degree or qualification being sought and the establishment being attended, plus any other information that may be useful to the Trust in dealing with your application. The application must be endorsed by a parent or guardian verifying the information given.

For a repeat grant application, i.e. further years of study where a previous grant has been given, it will be necessary to provide a detailed report of the previous year's studies with achievements and exam results, and how these will satisfy the overall course objective. A CV will also be required where one has not previously been supplied. A parent or guardian should endorse the application and verify its accuracy.

An application may be returned for completion if any of the above requirements are missing.

The Trust is also prepared to help students embarking on an apprenticeship who have expenditure in setting themselves up with tools, etc. The applicant should detail the apprenticeship being undertaken and the items required, should supply a CV, and the application should be endorsed by a parent or guardian.

The Trust will be meeting in mid-October to consider applications. This is the main grant meeting of the year when the Trust expects to make the bulk of its grants within its available budget. Applications received after this meeting, apart from having to wait until the Trust next meets, will also be dependent upon the Trusts' remaining available funds.

The Trust is not bound to make a grant, and cannot if it is not satisfied that the application or applicant is within its remit and the Trust scheme.

Applications should be sent to the Clerk to the Trustees, Mr K.H. London, Sir John Williams Trust, 17, Fairfield, Elham by 28th September.
